ACT WITH COURAGE

> 2 CHRONICLES 15:1-9

¹The Spirit of God came upon Azariah the son of Oded,² and he went out to meet Asa and said to him, "Hear me, Asa, and all Judah and Benjamin: The LORD is with you while you are with him. If you seek him, he will be found by you, but if you forsake him, he will forsake you.³ For a long time Israel was without the true God, and without a teaching priest and without law, ⁴ but when in their distress they turned to the LORD, the God of Israel, and sought him, he was found by them.⁵ In those times there was no peace to him who went out or to him who came in, for great disturbances afflicted all the inhabitants of the lands. ⁶ They were broken in pieces. Nation was crushed by nation and city by city, for God troubled them with every sort of distress. ⁷ But you, take courage! Do not let your hands be weak, for your work shall he rewarded "

⁸ As soon as Asa heard these words, the prophecy of Azariah the son of Oded, he took courage and put away the detestable idols from all the land of Judah and Benjamin and from the cities that he had taken in the hill country of Ephraim, and he repaired the altar of the LORD that was in front of the vestibule of the house of the LORD. ⁹ And he gathered all Judah and Benjamin, and those from Ephraim, Manasseh, and Simeon who were residing with them, for great numbers had deserted to him from Israel when they saw that the LORD his God was with him.



THE BIBLE MEETS LIFE

FACT:

THE PERSISTENCE OF MEMORY IS SALVADOR DALI'S MOST FAMOUS PAINTING. WHEN ASKED DIRECTLY ABOUT HIS INSPIRATION, DALI DECLARED HIS TRUE MUSE FOR THE DEFORMED CLOCKS WAS A WHEEL OF CHEESE THAT HAD MELTED IN THE SUN.² *If at first you don't succeed, try, try again.* We've all heard this cliché. But it can be pretty discouraging when one failure follows another, and every door seems to slam before us. Many people give in to the discouragement and move on to other pursuits. However, some keep going, no matter what.

- > Michael Jordan was cut from his high school basketball team.
- > Steven Spielberg was rejected by a film school three times.
- Walt Disney was fired from a newspaper for having no imagination.¹

Even when we get past the initial pain and difficulty related to failure, there are always more challenges. When life knocks us down again and again, it's then we're most tempted to give up. But if we want to make a difference, we must remember that it's often those who are most persistent who have the biggest impact on the world.

King Asa provides a great example of having courage in the face of challenges. He knew that continued success required his persisting in the good work he was doing. If the people were to remain focused on God, Asa had to continue leading in the same direction. When challenges persisted, he persisted more.

► CULTURE



THE 7 ARROWS OF **BIBLE READING**




DAY ONE **PSALM 27:7-8**

There may be times in our lives when we feel like we aren't as close to God as we should be. In fact, we may even feel like God isn't listening when we pray. David certainly felt like this at times. But he knew God had called him to seek His face. God's "face" represents His presence, and because God created us to live in relationship with Him, we are invited continually into His presence. David begged and pleaded with God to be gracious with him. Even though things didn't always go the way David wanted, he was committed to seeking God no matter what. At times, he may have questioned how things were going to turn out, but deep down in his heart, David always knew it was best to seek after God.

Why is it always best to seek God, even when we may not feel like it?

DAY TWO **PSALM 27:9-10**



David had determined to seek God's face, no matter the circumstances. He knew what it meant to be close to God, and he'd also experienced times when it seemed as if God's blessings had been removed from his life. It was one thing to seek God's face. However, if God decided to hide His face, then we'd have no hope of knowing God. David asked God not to reject him in anger. Because we've all sinned, we deserve God's anger and punishment. But because of Jesus, when we're willing to turn away from sin and follow Him, God will put away His anger, and in its place, we receive His grace and salvation. David knew God's forgiveness, and he'd come to trust that, even if those closest to him abandoned him, God would be with him.

DAY THREE PSALM 27:11-12

There are times when our lives become difficult, and we have no clue what we can do to make it better. Sometimes, the difficulties we face are due to our own foolishness, and it's pretty clear what we need to do—stop sinning and turn to God! However, at other times, even when we do what's right, we'll still face difficult things. These are the times that can be particularly challenging. David's response to this kind of situation was to pray. When he didn't know what to do or where to turn, he simply asked God to show him the way-to lead him on a path that was level and easy to follow. If you're feeling lost or confused or if you're going through a tough time, and it seems like you haven't received God's blessings in a long time, ask God to show you His way. If you're willing to walk in it, He's definitely willing to show you.

DAY FOUR **PSALM 27:13**

DAY FIVE PSALM 27:14

Have you ever said something like this? I just don't see any way this can ever get better! When we get caught up in the difficulties life inevitably throws at us, it often seems as if there's no end to the tunnel and certainly no light to be seen. However, we serve a God who is good in ways we can't even begin to imagine, and when things seem hopeless to us, God sees the bigger picture, and there's always hope in Him. David had been through times that seemed hopeless before, and he's seen God provide in unexpected ways. Based on God's track record, David had faith that God would come through again. Therefore, David said with confidence, "I am certain that I will see the Lord's goodness in the land of the living." David knew that, no matter what, God was working for his good, and he fully expected God would preserve his life.

- When have you felt like things would never get better?
- How has God been faithful in the past? How can this help you see beyond difficult circumstances?



We live in a culture where we expect to get what we want when we want it—and that's usually right now! This often translates into our expectations about God. When we face hardships, we want it to be over immediately. And when we pray, we expect God will instantly give us exactly what we've asked for. However, this isn't the way God works. He can choose this, if He wants. But more often, God wants us to wait. This leads to patience, steadfastness, and ultimately, Christlike maturity. David encouraged himself with these ideas—*Wait on God. Wait because God loves you, and He's at work.* When we struggle, let us be encouraged. There are good things in the waiting.
