The POINT >

We need the encouragement of others and they need ours.

> EPHESIANS 4:17-32

¹⁷ Now this I say and testify in the Lord, that you must no longer walk as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds. ¹⁸ They are darkened in their understanding, alienated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them, due to their hardness of heart. ¹⁹ They have become callous and have given themselves up to sensuality, greedy to practice every kind of impurity. ²⁰ But that is not the way you learned Christ!—
²¹ assuming that you have heard about him and were taught in him, as the truth is in Jesus, ²² to put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, ²³ and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, ²⁴ and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness.

²⁵ Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. ²⁶ Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, ²⁷ and give no opportunity to the devil. ²⁸ Let the thief no longer steal, but rather let him labor, doing honest work with his own hands, so that he may have something to share with anyone in need. ²⁹ Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. ³⁰ And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. ³¹ Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. ³² Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.

All of my life, I've enjoyed music. However, the thought of playing or singing in front of a crowd was absolutely terrifying when I was younger. My senior year of high school, I decided to give music a go, so I joined the choir. I could handle singing on stage with 35 other people. That mindset worked until my choir director assigned me a solo. Everything I had feared about pursuing music was becoming very real in ways I simply wasn't ready for; so naturally, I refused the solo.

Thankfully, our director didn't easily accept my "no," and he encouraged me to give it a shot. Day by day, he took the time to help me grow not only in my capacity to sing well, but also in my confidence. There was no end to his encouraging words, and this made a huge difference in my life. Not only did I sing the solo, but less than a year later, I decided to pursue music as my vocation. Because of his encouragement, music would become the primary way I'd serve the church and support my family for years.

In living out our faith, there will be many times we're hesitant, even afraid, to walk forward in the things God has called us to. Encouragement from fellow believers is more valuable than we often realize. Words of support can help us press forward when we might be tempted to give up. We need the encouragement of other believers, and they need ours.





DAILY DEVOTIONS



The 7 Arrows of Bible Reading



Day One HEBREWS 10:23

People often visit our churches, come to faith in Christ, and start off with a fire in their bellies. However, when this new life of faith doesn't go as smoothly as they'd imagined or even once the excitement wears off, many walk away. The Hebrews who received this letter were suffering for their faith, and they were tempted to walk away. But they were encouraged! Here's why. Faith in Christ gives us a hope for eternity that is available nowhere else. If they were to walk away, they may have avoided some difficult things, but they would also have lost the hope—the confident expectation that they would receive God's good promises—in Christ. God is faithful to deliver on His promises. In turn, He calls us to be faithful to our confession. When we hold on to Jesus, we can be sure we'll receive His eternal blessings.

Day Four

HEBREWS 10:25b

Encouragement is an essentially important part of following Christ. Without it, we'd all surely fall. But with it, we can make it through any difficulty. The Holy Spirit provides encouragement to God's people (Acts 9:31), and for that we should be incredibly thankful. But we must know that one of the greatest ways God provides encouragement in through the church. When we fail to engage regularly with the church, it's easy to become discouraged in our pursuit of Christ. We should remain continually engaged in the church, so we don't fall away. But there's one more (and perhaps even more important) reason to be a part of the church. It's so we can encourage others. To follow Jesus means to love others as much or more than we love ourselves. When we truly love our brothers and sisters, because of our concern for them, we'll involve ourselves in the church so we can be used to encourage others.

Day Five

HEBREWS 10:25c
